



Jim Santelle (Felix Ungar) In this his first show with The West Allis Players, Jim revels in the onstage opportunities to dispense helpful household tips on cleanliness and order. ("Try to eat over the dish. I just vacuumed the rug.") Among his previous non-tidy but favorite performances are Brendan Flynn in "Doubt," Flanders Kittridge

in "Six Degrees of Separation," George in "The Language Archive," Horace Gilmer in "To Kill a Mockingbird," Mel in "Come Back," Mitch in "Streetcar Named Desire," Steve Heidebrecht in "August: Osage County," Butch in "Next Fall," Sherlock Holmes in "The Final Adventure," Rob Brewster in "Playing Doctor," John Milton in "The Narrow Gate," and Martin Gray in "The Goat or Who is Sylvia?"

Jim conveys his profound theatrical appreciation to Ralph, Mary Beth, Sarah, Lance, Andrew, Todd, Tom, Molly, Maureen, both Scotts, and all of artistic leadership and creative professionals of the Players management. In ways big and small, seen and unseen, they inhabit and portray the best in narrative storytelling, reaffirming with every move: "You know what glasses do? Ruins the finish. Eats right through the polish!"

Lance Odom (Oscar Madison) whose love for the stage is more than just a passion—it's a lifeline. From the moment he first stepped onto the boards, the world of theater has been his sanctuary, a place where he found purpose and connection. Lance attributes his dedication to the stage with saving his life, providing



a creative outlet and a supportive community that has seen him through the best and worst of times. Now celebrating his 60th show, Lance continues to bring his boundless energy and heartfelt performances to each role. This production marks his 3rd collaboration with the West Allis Players. Playing Oscar in this iconic show is both an honor and a privilege, highlighting the transformative power of the arts and his unwavering commitment to the craft.



Andrew Wetzel (Murray) To my Darling Mimi, whose encouragement has returned me to the stage after almost 20 years. Also, thanks to fellow White Men with No Rhythm alumni for giving me the chance to be here. It's been loads of fun and I hope not to wait another 20 years.

Scott Kopischke (Speed) Scott has spent the past fifty years drifting through community theaters throughout southeastern Wisconsin, from Mukwonago Players to Falls Patio Players to Elm Grove's Sunset Playhouse, and finally here to West Allis. Scott's favorite rolls include Elwood P. Dowd (Harvey), Rick Steadman



(The Nerd) and Lloyd (Guys On Ice). When he's not acting, Scott is a prolific playwright, with over twenty titles and more on the way. Scott enjoys acting and writing, and wants to keep doing them both for as long as he can.



Todd Herdt (*Vinnie*) is pleased to be returning to the West Allis Players with such a talented cast and crew. Past favorite roles include Joe Farkis (The Last Night of Ballyhoo), Naphtali (Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat) and Beadseller #2 (Murder on the Nile). He hopes you enjoy the show!

Tom Jozwik (*Roy*) Sister Bertha, who mercilessly berated him for failing to understand borrowing in third grade math, is rolling in her grave knowing Tom has become an accountant—if only for the run of "The Odd Couple." Tom had more success with English, which he taught for some 30 years at MATC. His favorite stage roles include Elwood P. Dowd in "Harvey

Molly Dewane (Cecily Pigeon, Costume Design) This is Molly's third appearance with West Allis Players although she has acted with many other theaters in the Milwaukee area and southern California. Favorite roles include Melissa in "Love Letters"; Emily Dickinson in "Belle of Amherst"; Queen in

"Cymbeline" and Marian in "The Music Man." Favorite costume design projects include "Salome", "The Music Man", "As You Like It", and "Dear Charlotte." Fun fact: She did the costume design for both versions of The Odd Couple while living in southern California.

Maureen P. Lavin (Gwendolyn Pigeon) As one

of Mona's "ladies" in Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, Maureen helped "raise chickens." She scared the bejeepers out of you as Charwoman in A Christmas Carol and as the Doctor in Murder's Bad, But Monday Can Kill You. As Betsy, in The Visitation, she had her pipes cleaned. and then the plumber somehow wound up dead. As the aerobics instructor in Death by Chocolate, she helped "pump you up," while keeping you away from the chocolate. As Verna, in Old Ringers, she switched from Marilyn Monroe to Ethel Merman to a "pole dancer." As Annelle, in Steel Magnolias, she had a rather....um... "late term" pregnancy. As Carol, in Is Murder Tax Deductible?, she nearly bled her ex-husband dry. Maureen is grateful for the opportunity to be a Pigeon Sister in this production of The Odd Couple and sends many thanks to the Director, the Stage Manager, her fellow cast, the crew, and to the volunteers.




