Director's Notes

It is not, however, until Rick's (surprise) visit where Willum realizes that he is capable of so much more than what he has been doing, and owes his new-found sense of self all to this...well, in a word, "nerd."

In a way, Larry Shue's play, "The Nerd" ought to be changed to "The Heroes," because, it was Rick, and Willum's crew of friends, who banded together in the sprit and power of friendship, and gave him the courage to stand up for all that he truly wanted: Purpose, peace, and gumption. As you watch, think about your friends and loved ones; how they have helped you, how they have challenged you, and how, even in fits of annoyance/anger, they helped make you stronger than you were before. And, remember:


